Things everyone needs to know

Humans - This is the name given to us. We come from wider family of animals called mammals. Mammals give birth to live babies and feed their babies with milk. Most mammals are covered in hair. Other mammals include cats, dogs, cows and sheep.

Other common animals include fish, amphibians, reptiles, and birds.

Senses - all mammals, including humans, have five senses. They are: hearing, sight, touch, taste and smell.

Pupils will need to know which organs are associated with which of the senses.

We hear using our ears

We see using our eyes

We smell with our nose

We taste with our tongue when we put things in our mouth

We touch by using our hands and fingers

We have a brain, bones, and muscles that enable us to move.

We need to eat and drink to stay alive and we need a balanced diet. Humans are carnivores which means we eat meat and plants.

Exercise keeps us healthy.
