The Office


Mrs Adhanom, Mrs Sullivan and Miss Robinson

School would cease to function without these wonderful ladies. They will be your first port of call when you arrive into St Chad's where you will always be greeted with a warm smile. They go above and beyond to help our parents with anything that they may need help with. Mrs Adhanom speaks Tigrinya and Amharic and will happily help any parents, who need help with any translating. We are a cash free school and use Parentpay. This is a system which allows you to pay weekly for any school meals, trips and any purchases. Children in Reception/EYFS (Early Years Foundation Stage) and, Y1 and Y2 all receive free school dinners. In all other years, dinners will need to be paid for fully, in advance, unless eligible for free school meals (FSM).



Mrs Wheatley

Mrs Wheatley is our Inclusion Manager. She will provide considered support and help to our children and families. Mrs Wheatley is the main contact for any children who have additional needs. She is approachable and is always on hand if and when she is needed.



Mrs Azadeh

Mrs Azadeh is our Family Support Worker and Safeguarding Lead. She has worked at St Chad's for many years and has a great knowledge and understanding of the local community. She is always available to listen and support when it is needed. Mrs Azadeh is on the gate most mornings and will happily speak to anyone who needs some advice or help.

Mr Benjamin is our Pastoral Manager. He works closely with Mrs Azadeh and will support children who are maybe experiencing some emotional or behavioural needs. He is very calm but firm and always looks for extra ways to support the teachers and the children. Pupils are actively involved in planning and leading worship, both in class groups and whole school settings. Shared acts of worship take place in an atmosphere of reflection and stillness.

Each class has a prayer area, which is a focus during prayer times. The prayer areas continually change depending on what part of the Liturgical calendar we are in.




Mass

We are very lucky to be the Cathedral School of the Birmingham Archdiocese. The children will attend the cathedral for important masses and will also receive their sacraments there. We have mass in the school hall, weekly, on a Thursday morning at 9:15am. All parents and families are usually welcome to join us for mass. We are very lucky to have two priests who visit the school regularly to visit the children – Mgr. Timothy Menezes and Fr Thomas.

Due to the current restriction, we are all watching mass live from the Cathedral. We can't wait to once again celebrate mass as a school community and be able to sing together once again. We have a fantastic choir, which is run by Mrs Ashford, the Year 2 teacher and RE Lead.

Breakfast Club

We run a FREE breakfast club, thanks to Magic Breakfast, every morning from 7:55am -8:25am. The children have a choice of bagels, cereal, juice or a hot drink in the winter. There are also activities and plenty of time for the children to socialise. As we cannot run the club at his moment in time, due to the large numbers who attend, every child is offered breakfast upon arrival into school, in their own classrooms – bagels and milk.

School Meals

Healthy balanced meals of good quality are cooked and served on the school premises, incorporating arrange of healthy options such as a salad bar. We also have themed lunches such as American theme, Italian, school picnics in the summer and always a favourite our Carribean lunch.







Library



Reading is very important at St Chad's. We have a fabtastic selection of books in our library which all children have access to. We were very lucky to have a complete refurbishment of the library a few years ago.
